"April Showers . . .

... bring May flowers." You knew how that ended. Have you ever wondered why this phrase was coined? Was it, perhaps, to help people put up with a bunch of rain in April? April might be a dreary month, but without it May would not be near as bright.

Have you ever heard this phrase and thought, "True, but I thank God it doesn't just rain in April?" I've lived in enough rural communities to know crops kicked off by April rains end up stunted or fruitless without consistent rains May through September.

I love Isaiah 55. You know this if I've officiated at a funeral for your family. The prophet compares, "As the rain comes down . . . so is my Word." While we can't control how often or when it rains from the sky, we can control how often God's Word showers us with grace and peace through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.

When are your April showers? How often do you drench yourself with God's Word? Do you plan so that you are rained on consistently throughout the entire year? Do you look for the blossoms in your day to day life that will result? If you see your blossoms wilting, or you see less and less blossoms, you know it's time for a good watering. Come to worship. Come to Bible study. Schedule some one-on-one time with your pastor.

I have truly been blessed watching them blossom and bloom this past year in my classroom. From the Desk of the Church Administrator

Today, writing the article for the May Messenger is sharing time with Bible study preparation for this week at the Beacon Campus Center and for Cards and the Word. In addition to that, preparation for the Vespers service at the Beacon on Wednesday evening is also on my mind. Often I am asked what my work day is like. The best answer I can give is that it varies from day to day. Having been a teacher most of my career, I generally follow a schedule or "lesson plan" for the week. I write on a pad of paper all of the items that need to be done during the week, with room for adjustments as needed. There are items that come up that throw things off. But as in all types of work, if it's something that needs to be done, allowances must be made for it. At the end of the week, if all of the items on the lesson plan are crossed off, I take the time to thank God for giving me the patience, endurance and capabilities to finish it. If some things are left on the list, again, it is the time to thank the Lord for giving me the fortitude to do what he had planned for me to do for the given week. Then, if it is his will for me, they will be done the following week.

Our office staff is so very good at recognizing that the called workers here at St. Paul's have many different challenges. We very much appreciate their assistance in getting St. Paul's work finished! We are so blessed here at St. Paul's to have such a dedicated staff of workers, not only in the administrative office, but also in our custodial crew as well. Recently, a visitor to our church remarked how well our team works together. They said that everyone was so pleasant and worked together like a well oiled machine.

All of us here are pleased and happy to work for the Lord and to do the tasks he has laid out before us. There are times, situations or challenges that can place a road block or stumbling block in our way. When we see one of our Lord's workers, whether he or she is a part of the called staff, hired staff, volunteers or regular member, who is troubled or under a heavy burden, it is our duty to follow the scripture of 1 Thessalonians 5:11. "Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing." Encouragement to build each other up is so very much a part of our ministry. Giving that person a shoulder to lean on or a shoulder to help carry the burden is so much appreciated. Our encouragement gives that person the incentive and the assurance, so when someone else needs this same, they, too, will follow your lead.

From the Desk of the Church Administrator

Improvements to the Fellowship Activities Bulletin Board outside of the Administrative office are in the process of being made. This board is our way of promoting or advertising various upcoming events. As you walk through the Commons hallway, stop by this board to check out what is coming up or information about future events.

Facility update

The final layer of asphalt will be laid on the parking lot the first week of May. Once that is completed, the lines will be painted to mark the parking spaces. As expected, there was some settling of the base to the parking lot over the winter months. Ground Zero will be coming to level these areas prior to the final paving. The response of our members towards the reduction of the loan for this project has been excellent. The remaining balance of the loan is just over \$33,000, which is the equivalent of 33 parking spots. Please keep this in your thoughts and prayers. The monthly payment to pay off this loan is \$550, which goes for interest and principal. The sooner we pay down or pay off the principal owed, the sooner we will no longer have to make this monthly installment.

Summer facility projects will be limited this year to primarily the Commons area restrooms and possibly the windows in the upstairs classrooms. Until the loan for the parking lot is satisfied, extra funds for these projects is not available. It is the Support Board's intention of replacing the sinks, countertops and toilets in the restrooms. The windows in the second story classrooms are in poor shape. The sills have rotted out and replacing them is the only option. To complete these two projects is estimated to cost between \$20,000 and \$25,000. Funds for these projects are not available, so work will be done as monies are available.

As in past years, the floors and carpets in the JLMLC will be cleaned the first week of July when the center is closed. Carpeting in other areas of the facility will be done as well, as needed, in the remainder of the facility.

<u>Feed My Lambs</u>

Scrap for Cash is starting up once again this summer. The dates to drop off your unwanted or spare scrap are May 10th, June 14th, July 12th and August 9th. Remember we are unable to accept tires, refrigerators, freezers, mattresses and box springs. If you have something that you would like us to pick up, please contact the church office and arrangements will be made with you. Over the past four years, this program has raised over \$12,000.

4 F Funds

Graduation


